

TITLE: KOSHISH FOR SLOW LEARNER

Objective: 1. Strategies to help slow achievers succeed.
2. Encouraging students to become historically or culturally sound.

Content: The college is assembled with majority of students coming from economically backward classes comprising of SCs, STs and OBCs. It was observed that many students find difficulties in grasping concept. They often struggle with understanding and retaining new concept. They do not respond well and show signs of anxiety. 2. Today acquiring extra knowledge above regular course of study is extremely important. We have decided to go ahead with progressive steps in tune with the vision and mission of the college. The college has done various programmes like Har Ghar Tiranga, Students Day, Quiz Competition for making students culturally sound. Evidence of Success: After the introduction of tutorial or remedial classes in the college for the CBCS students of 2018-19 session, it is observed that it had a positive impact on their academic performance. The pass percentage of the final year students of CBCS course increased drastically in comparison to the non-CBCS students of the college. The final year CBCS students graduated from the college with good grades and percentage.

The table below shows the number of students appeared and passed in final exam of CBCS course:

The above table shows that 24 students (CBCS) have passed in the session 2020-21 and all of them secured 60 % and above. In the 2021-22 session, out of 30 students, 24 students (CBCS) passed and they all secured 60 % and above. In the same way, in the session 2022-23, 76 students appeared in the final exam and out of which 40 students (CBCS) passed and they all secured 60 % and above.
