

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Considering the yearning of this locality in respect of Higher Education ,the people of this area decided to start a Degree College at Lakhipur Town in the Name of Satindra Mohan Dev,the illustrious son of Barak Valley and as a result of this noble idea this Degree College was established on 25-03-1995. The Governing Body of the college obtained its registration from the Registrar of Societies, Assam as per norms of the Assam University,Silchar. The college was formally inaugurated on 27-07-1995 under the Presidentship of Sri Dinesh Prasad Goala, the then Minister of P.H.E, Government of Assam and President of the Governing Body.



The original owner of the land of the college was Late Chitta Ranjan Sheel. The area of land measures 3(three) bighas & 3 (three) chattaks. As he had none to inherit him, he before his demise, handed over the land to the Lakhipur Town Committee with a request to utilize it for some noble purpose. Accordingly when the proposal to establish a Degree college was taken, Lakhipur Town committee authority was kind enough to donate the land for the College. Sri Kalyan Chandra Dey, the then Chairman of Lakhipur Town Committee executed the deed and handed over the land to the College authority.

The College is situated at Lakhipur Town under Cachar district surrounded by a good number of Tea gardens. In order to cater the need of Higher Education of the students of this locality, this Degree College was a basic need for the people. The College has been imparting education to the students coming from the Tea garden areas in particular and has been able to achieve its objectives to a great extent. This is the only Degree college at Lakhipur Town where students coming from the Tea garden & its surrounding areas as well as students from other backgrounds in the locality can hope to receive an education.

The College was permitted by the Assam University, Silchar to start its Classes in the year 1995. Initially the college was started with Arts Stream. In 2013-14 academic Session, the Commerce wing of the college was opened. The college obtained Permanent Affiliation for Arts & Commerce Stream from Assam University, Silchar. During the Session 2020-21, the college was provincialised under the Assam venture Educational Institutions (Provincialisation of Services) Amendment Act, 2018.

At present the College has three Assam type full brick walled RCC building having the plinth area of 5700 sq.ft . The construction work of the ground floor having the plinth area of 7000 sq.ft of the multi-storied building has already been completed. The College has several class rooms, spacious and well furnished lecture halls and library. One big hall serves the purpose of Auditorium. The 2nd phase of Construction in the College is in Progress and is scheduled to be completed soon. This includes a new administrative block, class rooms & etc.

Well-experienced faculty members and non-teaching staff are available who work hard to provide quality education and bring all round development of the students and the college.


• College library:

THREE YEARS DEGREE PROGRAMME UNDER CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

1) <u>SCHEME OF STUDIES</u>:-

The Three Years Degree Course of the college under CBCS in Arts & Commerce leading to B.A and B.Com Degrees respectively is affiliated to Assam University, Silchar and, as such, is governed by the statutes, Rules and Regulations of the University. Each Programme is split into six Semester with six End Semester examinations. All the six examinations are conducted by the Assam University and the final Degree is awarded on the basis of the composite scores in the Three- Years-Six-Part time examinations.

2) PROGRAMME OF STUDY UNDER CBCS:-

The programme of study to be called as Three Years Degree course (TDC) under choiced based credit system (CBCS) and in short TDC (CBCS) General shall be a six semester programme of 3 (three) years' duration.

3) ELIGIBILITY FOR AWARD OF DEGREE :-

A registered student shall be eligible for the award of Bachelor's Degree only if he/she has undergone the TDC(CBCS) programme of study in a college affiliated to the University for a period of not less than three academic years and successfully completes all the examinations of all semesters prescribed for the programme. The TDC (CBCS) General Programme may be awarded any one of the following Bachelor's Degree on successful completion of the Programme by passing all the prescribed course structure with minimum of 132 credits:

B.A & B.COM

Each programme shall follow specific courses, papers,credit & marks requirements as per the course structures.

4) **DURATION OF PROGRAMME STUDY :-**

- Each academic year of the TDC(CBCS) programme of study shall be divided into two semesters. The first academic year shall comprise the first and 2nd semesters, the second academic year, the third & fourth semesters and third academic year the fifth & sixth sememesters respectively.
- ii) The odd & even semesters shall consist of the period as per the academic calendar published by the university.

iii) Maximum duration for the completion a TDC(CBCS) programme of study is
 5 (five) years at a stretch from the date of Admission (i,e 10(ten) consecutive End Semester Examinations)

5) CREDIT REQUIREMENTS:-

Minimum credit requirement to complete the TDC (CBCS) General shall be 132

6) ADMISSION TO HIGHER SEMESTER AFTER END SEMESTER EXAMINATIONS :-

Admission to immediate next higher semester(II/III/iv/v/vi semester) after each End semester Examinations(ESE) shall be mandatory for each & every student with or without arrear Paper/s. Such admission procedure shall start after the completion of End Semester Examinations and shall be completed well before the commencement of classes of the respective Semester. Procedure including the schedule of such admission shall be notified by the concerned college for each & every semester.

7) <u>UNIT TEST</u> <u>MAXIMUM MARKS</u>:-


Courses with only theory paper :- 20 (Twenty)

Courses with both theory & Practical Paper : - 14 (Fourteen)

There shall be two unit test per semester for each & every theory paper excluding Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC) & Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) & date of such tests shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations. The highest marks secured by a student out of two unit test shall be awarded to the student as the marks under Test of CCA.

There shall be no unit test for practical papers. A student who fail to secure minimum pass marks in unit Test of CCA, of a paper, shall not be allowed to appear in concerned paper of ESE.





GENERAL GUIDELINES

1) ADMISSION

a) Candidate for admission to first semester of TDC(CBCS) shall be required to have passed the H.S(+2) or its equivalent examinations conducted by any recognised University /Board/Council,which shall be treated as qualifying examination. Provided that candidates for admission into the specific programme of study shall also possess such other qualifying conditions as may be prescribed by the University or concerned college.

No candidate shall be admitted to First semester of TDC(CBCS) programme of study, unless he/she has passed the qualifying examinations.

- b) Students will be admitted on the basis of their merit.
- c) The process of admission to the B.A & B.Com First Year classes will start immediately after the declaration of Higher Secondary and equivalent examinations' result and on the dates notified by the college authority.
- d) ADMISSION FEE- All fees other than the University Registration & Examination Fee will have to be paid at the time of admission. The details will be notified in the college Notice Board.
- e) DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION-

Students are directed to enclose the copies of the following documents alongwith the application Form for admission and to produce the original copies at the time of Admission for verification.

- i) 2 (Two) copies of recent passport sized coloured photograph.
- ii) 1(One) copy of recent stamp sized coloured photograph.
- iii) Photo copy of Markseet, Admit card & Pass certificate of HSLC Examinations.
- iv) Photo copy of Marksheet, Admit card, Registration Card & Pass certificate of H.S Final examination.
- v) Gap certificate (in case of gap after passing H.S final examinations)

2> Attendance

Each student shall have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/ Tutorials/Practical classes in each paper of all the courses as per the recommended course structure of the concerned programme of study. Students attending less than 75% of the total No. of lectures shall not be allowed to appear in the university examinations.

<u>3> Unit Test</u>

A student must have to appear in both the unit test for each Semester and every theory paper excluding AECC and SEC and secure pass mark. A student who fails to secure pass mark in CCA, of a paper shall not be allowed to appear in the concerned paper of the End Semester Examination

4> Change of Subjects

- a) In general change of subject(S)/ combination is not encouraged . Students should give proper thought in the matter before filling in their application form for admission.
- b) If, in extreme case, a student is bound to change the subject(S)/ combination he/she has to apply within 15 (fifteen) days from the date of admission to college office. Application will be entertained subject to the availability of seats in respective subject(S)/combination and approval of respective H.O.D.

5> College Uniform

a) Wearing college uniform is a must for each and every student of the college . The students shall wear college uniforms on all days.

Dress code for Boys :-

- 1> Shirt : Full sleeve or half sleeve with one frontal pocket and No plate- Sandal colour .
- 2> Trouser :- With two side pockets , No bottom fold- Coffee colour .
- **3> Shoe :- Black leather**
- 4> Socks :- Coffee colour , plain
- 5> Belt :- 1.25 inches ,plain and simple
- 6> Sweater :- Front close 'V' neck , plain sleeveless or full sleeve , coffee colour (winter season)
- **b) Dress code for Girls :-**
 - 1> Kamiz :- Sandal colour; close round neck with 10 to 12 inches side cut (Bottom) ; Full sleeve or Half sleeve ; length up to knees.
 - 2> Salowar :- Coffee colour .
 - 3> Chhunni :- 'V' shape with 6 inches plate coffee colour .
 - 4> Shoe :- Black foot wear
 - 5> Socks :- Coffee colour , plain
 - 6> Sweater :- Front open 'V' neck , full sleeve or sleeveless , coffee colour (winter season)

6> **Discipline**

(Students are expected to adhere to guidelines for discipline)

- a) Great emphasis is laid on discipline and character building of students.
- b) Students are required to furnish an undertaking at the time of admission in respect of the students' regular attendance in classes and appearance in college examinations. The undertaking is copied below :

I do hereby furnish the undertaking that :

i) I shall attend atleast 75% of classes held in the college to appear in the university Exam.

ii) I shall also appear at all the unit test conducted by the college .

iii) I shall obey the college uniform code in toto .

- c) Failure to fulfil the requisite number of attendance will debar a student from appearing in the university examinations .
- d) The students admitted to the college must abide by rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authorities. Violation of rules and showing discourtesy to the teachers and staff members in any form are liable for strict disciplinary action .
- e) All form of ragging are strictly prohibited and will make a student liable to punitive/disciplinary action .
- f) If any property/equipment in the campus is damaged, the loss caused to the institution shall be recovered from the concerned students .
- g) Students are strictly prohibited using mobile phones, chewing Gutkhas etc. inside the college campus .
- h) Students are prohibited from indulging anti-institutional, anti-national, anti-social, communal, ,immoral or political expression and activities within or outside the campus.
- i) Any conduct which leads to lowering of the dignity and honour of the college (including social Net working sites/ Media) is prohibited.
- j) No student shall leave the college campus when session is on without the written permission of the college authority.
- k) Attendance to the College Functions like college assembly, seminars, group discussions, etc. are obligatory to all students.
- 1) All powers of maintenance of discipline are vested with the Head of the institution and his decision shall be final in all such matters.
